- (c) Give ONE reason why family members should show care and concern for Maya's aging mother. **(2 marks)**
- (d) (i) Suggest to young persons, giving full details, THREE actions they can take to show care and concern for their aging relatives. **(6 marks)**
- (ii) Explain fully why EACH action is likely to be successful. **(6 marks)**

- (c) Explain TWO reasons why members of a group may have difficulty agreeing on an issue. **(4 marks)**
- (d) (i) Suggest to the members of the Greening interest group, giving full details, THREE strategies they can use to encourage their leader to change his leadership style. **(6 marks)**
- (ii) Explain fully why EACH strategy is likely to be successful. **(6 marks)**

(c) Give TWO reasons why young adults may NOT follow the cultural practices of their ancestors. (4 marks)

(d) (i) Suggest to the officials of the Ministry of Culture, giving full details, THREE strategies they can use to promote a national culture based on the country's heritage. (6 marks)

(ii) Explain fully why EACH strategy is likely to be successful. (6 marks)
